

Q - To the memory of MR. James Fraser of DUMFRIES Scotland who died at Darien December 28th 1828 Aged 69 years His sons caused this monument tablet to be erected as a feeble testimony of their affection and in commendation of his virtues A.D. MDCCCXXIX

R - To the memory of Ann Frances Wyly Born at Nassau, New Providence March 14, 1798. Died 22nd January 1846.

P - Clarence Brainerd Fraser Son of William and Frances Fraser, born at Darien April 13th 1835. died August 20th 1835. "Of such is the Kingdom of Heaven."

S - Sacred to the memory of Susannah Cunningham Wyllie Daughter of Alexander C. Wyllie & Margaret Wyllie died on the 19th October 1829 at the residence of Dr. Hamilton Cooper Esq. Wayne County

T. - Margaret RESURGEMUS Relict of Alexander Campbell Wyllie Died 12th Sept. 1850; aged 81 years. "None lament her but to love her, Nor named her but to praise."


U - To the memory of Alexander Campbell Wyllie Died 5 May 1853 Aged 75 years







A - Sacred to the memory of Hannah consort of Maj. Wm Page who died 29 Sep 1826 Aged 67 years \$4 mo.

Sacred to the memory of Major William Page who died 12 Jan 1827 aged 63 years & 10 days

B - Capt. Mallory Page King C.S.A. Born at Retreat St. Simons Island, GA. Entered into rest June 20, 1899 Brunswick, GA.

C - Maria Eugenia Grant consort of Mallory Page King born at Elizapild Plantation Glynn Co. GA. Entered into rest January 30, 1909, Brunswick, GA.

D - Thomas Butler only son of M.P. & M.E. King born Jan 27, 1875 Died July 22, 1877 "Suffer little children to come unto me."

E - Capt. Henry Loach Page King C.S.A. Third son of Thos. B. and Anna King. Died at Fredericksburg, VA., Dec 13, 1862, advancing gallantly in the storm of battle on Mary's Hill he fell pierced by five balls. aged 31 years.
"Dulce et decorum est pro patria mori"

F - Thos. Butler King JR. 1829-1859 Second son of Thos. B. and Anna King. Beloved son and brother. Faithful friend. "The voice of the weeper wails manhood in glory".

G - William Page Eldest son of T. Butler and Anna M. King. Born December 25th 1826. Ob. July 9th 1833. Aged 6 years 6 months and 14 days. "Suffer little children to come unto me and forbid them not for of such is the kingdom of God."

H - Thomas Butler King 1800-1864
Anna Matilda Page 1798-1859 His devoted wife. A profound statesman who labored faithfully for the public good. A man gentle and true. A devoted husband and father. A kind master.
