There is so little that friends can say or do that helps, but I did want you to know that you have been in my thoughts many times.

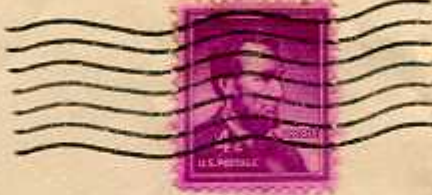
