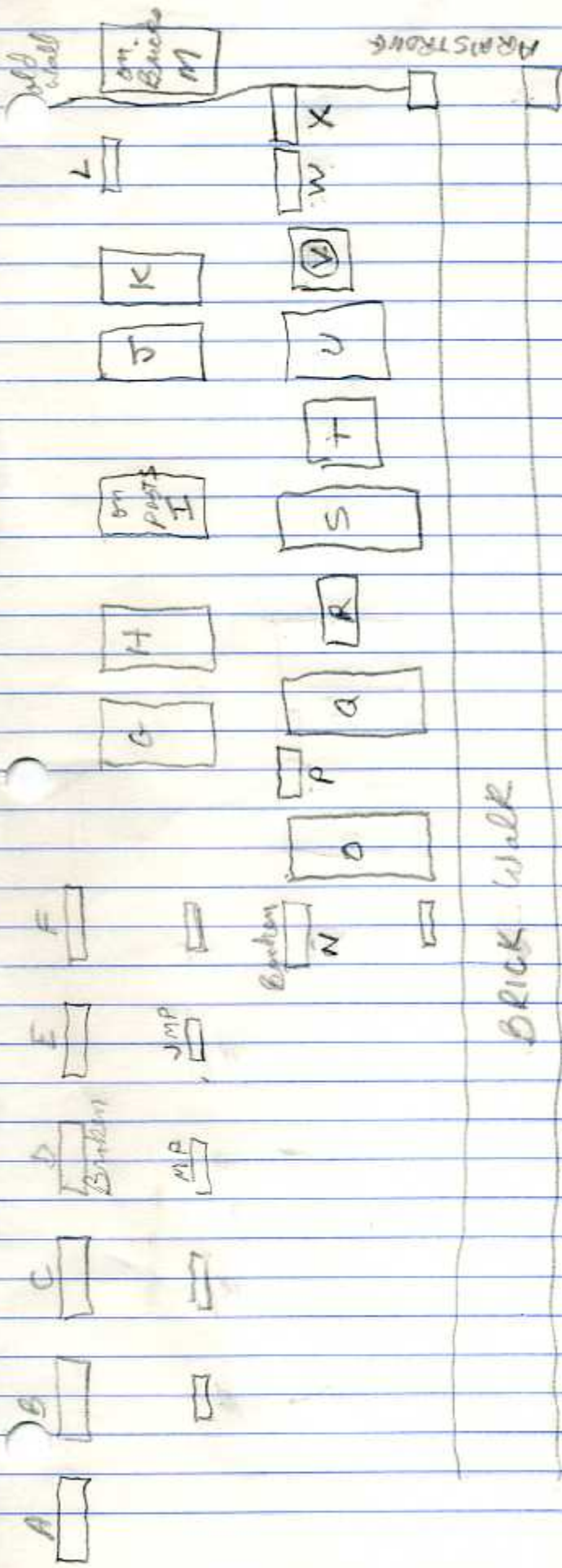

Simons Island the 18 of July 1839
- H - Sacred to the memory of Sophia Julia Daughter  
of John and Anne S. Fraser Born the 11<sup>th</sup> of  
June 1834 Died the 1<sup>st</sup> of Novr 1839
- I - Sacred to the memory of Ann Armstrong  
Relict of William Armstrong ES of the  
Bahama Islands Died at S. Clair  
S. Simons April 1, 1816 Aged 82 years
- J - Sacred to the memory of Benjamin  
Franklin Cater who died at his residence  
on St. Simons Island, the 29<sup>th</sup> August 1839  
Aged 43 years, He was an honorable man,  
A sincere friend, A kind and affectionate  
husband and parent.

- K - In memory of Anne wife of Benjamin Cates who died 7<sup>th</sup> Feb 1835 in the 33<sup>rd</sup> year of her age. "Cradled in its quiet deep. Calm as Summer's lonest eve; She shall sleep the hallowed sleep. Sleep that is Oer' watched by Heaven" This tablet is erected by Husband.
- L - Thomas Bourke Postell Mar 20, 1866 July 17, 1886.
- M - unreadable stone
- N - Broken stone M.C. on footstone
- O - Sacred to the memory of MR. James GIERIE a native of AIBROATH Scotland who died at his residence St. Simons Island 5<sup>th</sup> July 1830 Aged 45 years
- Q - To the memory of MR. James Fraser of DUMFRIES Scotland who died at Darien December 28<sup>th</sup> 1828 Aged 69 years His sons caused this monument Tablet to be erected as a feeble testimony of their affection and in commendation of his virtues A. D. MDCCCXXIX
- R - To the memory of Ann Frances Wylly Born at Nassau, New Providence March 14, 1798. Died 22<sup>nd</sup> January 1846.
- P - Clarence Brantford Fraser Son of William and Frances Fraser, born at Darien April 13<sup>th</sup> 1835. Died August 20<sup>th</sup> 1835. "Of such is the Kingdom of Heaven."

S - Sacred to the memory of Susannah  
Cunningham Wyllly Daughter of  
Alexander C. Wyllly & Margaret Wyllly  
Died on the 19<sup>th</sup> October 1829  
at the residence of Ja. Hamilton Cooper Esq.  
Wayne County

T. - Margaret RESURGEMUS Relict of  
Alexander Cambell Wyllly Died 12<sup>th</sup> Sept.  
1850; Aged 81 years. "None lament her  
but to love her, Nor named her but to praise."

V - Sacred to the memory of John Armstrong  
Wyllly who fell a victim to his

XC - memory of Rebecca Spalding Wylly Born March 9, 1843  
Died May 7, 1912 "In life she was loving to all.  
and in death her love is not forgotten for her.  
Her husband doth safely trust, seraphs guarding  
angles and arch-angles waiting, Loved once now  
saints-departing waving welcome. Made glorious  
her coming into the city of our Lord. For it is  
fitting to him that overcometh will I grant to

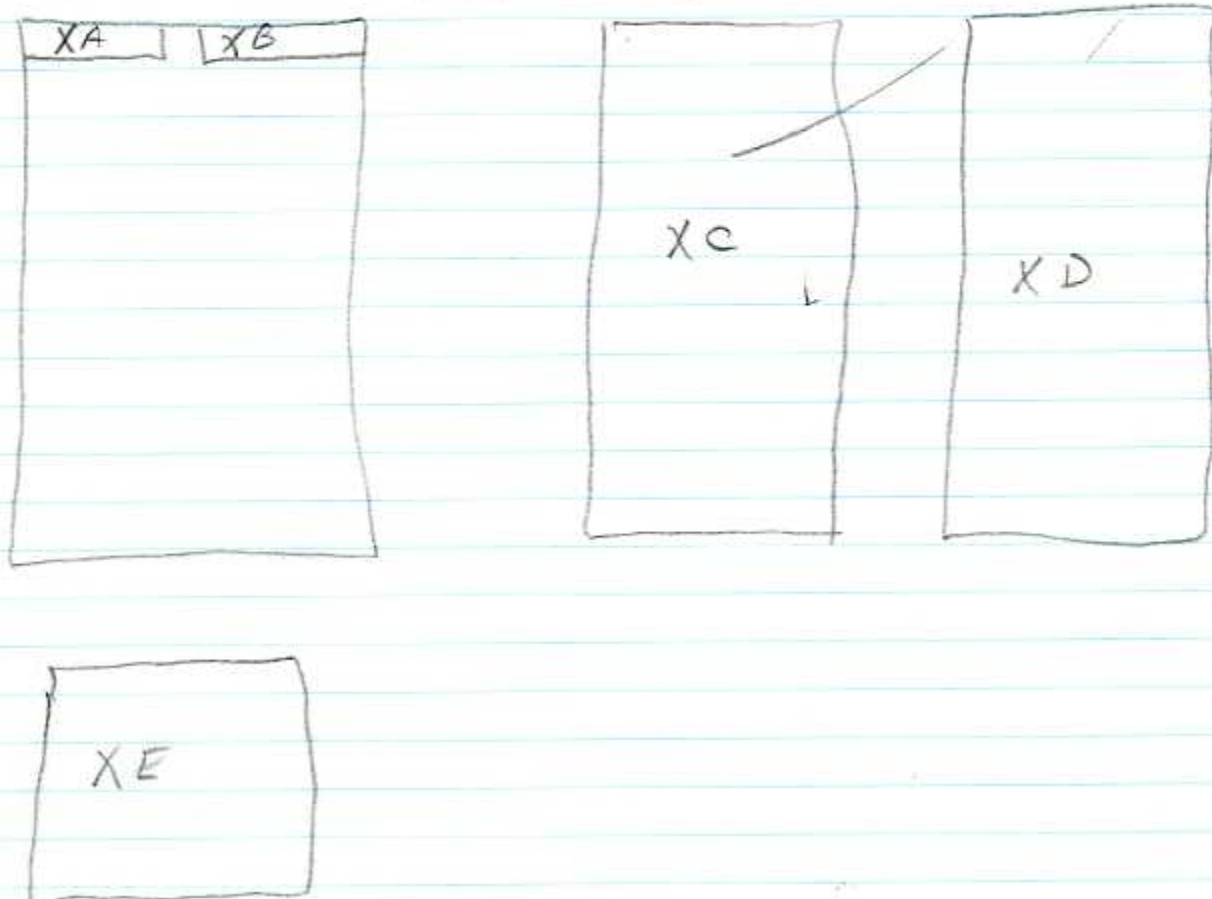
L - Sacred to the memory of John Lord Couper
