Suspension of Money-Order Business with Romania.

OFFICE OF THIRD ASS'T P. M. GEN.,
WASHINGTON, August 17, 1916.

This Department has just received information to the effect that, on July 1st, last, the Postal Administration of Switzerland suspended its exchange of money orders with the Kingdom of Romania, and consequently will no longer forward to the latter country remittances of money orders issued in the United States. Until otherwise instructed, therefore, postmasters in the United States will decline to issue money orders on Romania through Switzerland.

Special Precautions Regarding Money Orders in Favor of Mexicans.

OFFICE OF THIRD ASS'T P. M. GEN.,
WASHINGTON, Aug. 18, 1916.

Report has been made to the Department that "money orders intended for payment to Mexican women have been wrongly paid to Mexican men and vice versa." It is therefore requested that, as an aid to identification, when money orders are issued in favor of persons of that nationality, postmasters will indicate the payee's sex by appending the appropriate prefix, "Senor," "Senora," or "Senorita;" Mr., Mrs., or Miss.

Spanish names for women most frequently end with the letter "A" as "Amalia," "Anastasia," "Juana," "Maria," "Manuela."
Merchants and other business men should be warned not to cash money orders for unknown or irresponsible persons. If they accept orders from strangers it will be at their own risk.

NOTICE TO POSTMASTERS AND ALL POSTAL EMPLOYEES.

OFFICE OF THE POSTMASTER GENERAL,
WASHINGTON, August 14, 1916.

Because of misleading statements appearing in certain newspapers regarding the status of those postal employees who are now in the military service of the United States, postmasters and other supervisory officers in the postal service will call to the attention of employees under their supervision, who are now in the military service of the United States, the provisions of Postmaster General's Order No. 9747, of June 26, 1916, and again advise them that every postal employee immediately upon his discharge from the military service will be assigned to the position held by him at the time he left the postal service to enter the military service, and that such assignment to duty will be made at his former salary without awaiting the formal approval of the Post Office Department. I desire that not only the postal employees themselves but also that their families understand that the employees are not to suffer the loss of their positions because of having been called into the military service of their country.
